

## **Guidelines - Abstract Submission for the EUROSPINE Annual Meeting 2026 in Gothenburg**

### **Abstract Submission:**

- All abstracts must be submitted in English and uploaded online by 24 February 2026. No exceptions will be made.
- Abstract available categories are:
  - Basic Science & Economics
  - Complications & Epidemiology
  - Growing Spine
  - Trauma
  - Tumours & Infection
  - Degenerative Thoracolumbar
  - Cervical and Neural Pathologies
  - Adult Deformity

### **New this year:**

**You will be able to select a subcategory with treatment options (MIS, Open, Non-Operative) in each category and mark if an abstract should be considered in a “New Technologies” section.**

- The text of the abstract should not exceed 3,000 characters (each letter, space and punctuation mark count as one character). Please note that the submission system will count in lines which will equal your number of characters.
- Required structure: Title, Introduction, Methods, Results, Conclusions.
- Avoid special characters that may cause formatting issues.
- Figures or Tables: Limited to (2) figures or tables per abstract. Legends and/or references must be in English.
- Case reports and technical notes should be submitted as ePoster (as these are generally not considered for paper presentation).
- Presenters may not use their abstract to market products or services.
- Editing of abstracts after the submission deadline is not permitted and will not be accepted.
- References to trade names or specific company product lines are prohibited in abstracts and presentations.
- No patient, author or other provenance information can be displayed.
- Potential or current conflicts of interest, funding sources, royalties or similar related to the subject matter or results of the abstract in the last 24 months must be declared to the Programme Committee by each author at the time of submission.

## Originality and Prior Publication

- Abstracts must contain original data that have not been published in a peer-reviewed journal before the EUROSPINE abstract submission deadline.
- As a rule, data should be presented for the first time at the EUROSPINE Annual Meeting. If closely related work has already been presented elsewhere, the abstract must include substantial new data or analyses, and this must be declared during submission.
- The same study, patient cohort or dataset must not be split into several abstracts with only minor differences in title or focus. Multiple abstracts from one project are only acceptable if they address clearly distinct and non-overlapping research questions.

## Use of Artificial Intelligence (AI) and AI-Assisted Tools

- Authors are fully responsible for the originality, accuracy, and integrity of all submitted content.
- Generative AI tools (e.g. ChatGPT or similar systems) may only be used to improve the language and readability of text based on the authors' own work and real data.
- AI tools must not be used to fabricate, invent, or alter data, patient characteristics, study methods, results, or references. Abstracts that are not based on genuine data, or that contain invented or unverifiable results, will be rejected as scientific misconduct.
- AI systems cannot be listed as authors or co-authors.

## Abstract Reviewing:

- Abstracts will be reviewed anonymously without reference to authors or institutions to ensure fairness.
- Abstracts containing names of institutions, cities or similar attributes in the abstract text that allow conclusions to be drawn about the abstract author will be rejected.
- Abstracts with delayed outcome data will not be considered. All data presented must appear in the original abstract.

## Abstract Selection

- Abstracts selected for presentation (oral or ePoster) will be selected at the discretion of the Programme Committee to ensure a fair and balanced programme.
- If an abstract is not accepted as a full paper, it may be accepted as an ePoster instead. The final choice of presentation format is at the discretion of the Programme Committee.
- Notification of acceptance and information on presentations will be sent to authors by email immediately after the review process in May 2026.

## Abstract Presentation & Registration of the Presenting Author:

- Impeccable English is mandatory for all speakers/presenters.
- For an abstract to be included in the final scientific programme either as an oral presentation or an ePoster, the presenting author is required to register for the EUROSPINE Annual Meeting and pay the registration fee upon receipt of the abstract acceptance notification. For Oral presentations the deadline for payment of the registration fee is 30 June 2026. For ePoster presentations the deadline for payment of the registration fee is with the upload of the ePoster. If payments are not received by this date, the presentation will be taken from the programme.
- For scientific sessions (oral presentations, Spine Science Chat, Best of Show), the presenting author must be a healthcare professional or researcher directly involved in the study. In general, presenters should not be employees of a commercial company whose products or devices are the primary focus of the abstract, unless explicitly approved by the Programme Committee.
- Change of the presenting author: the delegate presenter must be listed as an author or co-author in the original abstract submitted and must meet all the conditions set out here. In all cases, the scientific team must be informed of any changes to the presenting author by email to [scientific@eurospine.org](mailto:scientific@eurospine.org) on or before 30 June 2026.
- Failure to present a scheduled abstract within the allotted time slot on-site will result in the author being disqualified from presenting any abstract or paper at the next three EUROSPINE Annual Meetings or any other EUROSPINE meeting within the next three years.
- Requests for withdrawal of an accepted abstract by the author must be received in writing to [scientific@eurospine.org](mailto:scientific@eurospine.org) by 1 June 2026.

## Legal Terms and Conditions:

By submitting an abstract, the submitting author and the co-authors acknowledge and agree that:

- All accepted abstracts will be published in the EUROSPINE journal "brain & spine" and on the EUROSPINE platforms.
- The Author hereby represents and warrants to EUROSPINE that: (i) the Author is the owner or authorised licensee of all right, title and interest (including all copyrights and other intellectual property rights) in and to all Content that appears in the abstract;(ii) all Content appearing in the Abstract is the original work of the Author and does not contain any defamatory or unlawful statements, violate the rights or privacy of others or contain material that may cause harm or injury, (iii) the submission of the Abstract by the Author does not and will not breach or otherwise violate any written or oral agreement or arrangement between the Author and any third party;(iv) EUROSPINE's use of the Abstract provided by the Author and EUROSPINE's exercise of its rights under the Licence will not infringe or violate any copyright or other intellectual property right of any third party.
- Upon acceptance of the abstract, the author hereby grants EUROSPINE an irrevocable, perpetual licence to maintain, store, cache, copy and distribute (in any current or future media) the abstract (the 'licence grant').

- The licence granted includes the right for EUROSPINE to include the Abstract in its current and future database(s) and to distribute the Abstract electronically to third parties via one or more websites operated by or on behalf of EUROSPINE, as well as the right to edit, publish, reproduce, reformat, distribute the Abstract in whole or in part and to create derivative works of any kind, such as press releases and/or educational products. The licence granted includes the right to use or reproduce the abstract in indexes or search databases in print, electronic or other media.
- All oral presentations may be recorded and published on the EUROSPINE platforms only.
- Authors submitting an abstract to EUROSPINE do so with the understanding that they must abide by the conditions, deadlines and decisions of the EUROSPINE Programme Committee.
